

# Vulvar Endometriosis

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A 37-year-old multiparous woman presented with acyclical vulvar pain that began nine months post partum. She had also noted vulvar swelling. Her menstrual cycle was regular, and she had no bladder or bowel symptoms.

On pelvic examination, a brownish swelling on the right internal fold of the labia majora was noted (Figure 1). It was tender on palpation. The remainder of the pelvic examination was unremarkable.

The lesion was subsequently removed under general anaesthesia. Histologically, the lesion was shown to be an endometriotic cyst, with endometrial glands and stroma present (Figure 2). The patient's postoperative course was uneventful. Her symptoms disappeared, and she remained free of disease 17 months later.
